- 同义替换(同义或近义类型词汇的替换表达),在各类学术文章当中出现的均很频繁,在各类英语考试中也都是重要的考查内容。
- 在阅读高级别的学术文章的过程中,对于词汇基本的理解是一个重点,但更多的是则要能够通过词汇的替换来灵活分析和理解文章。
- 同义替换有一个显著特点是它不会在生词难词上做文章。
- 正是由于很多概念和表达的常用性,在日常生活中才会存在着大量的替换说法。
